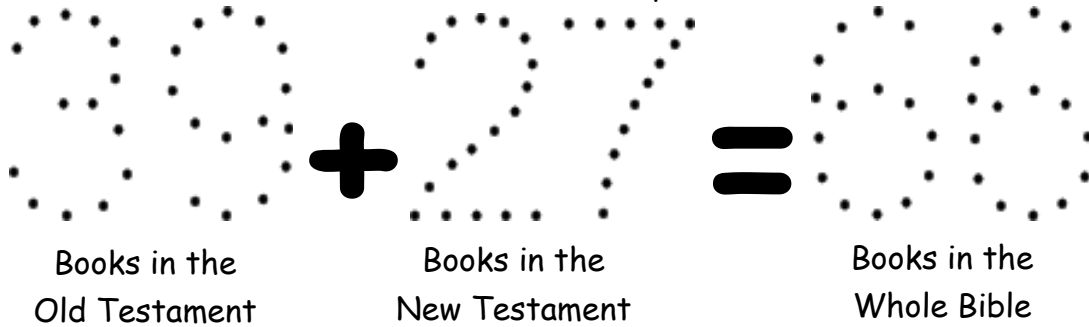

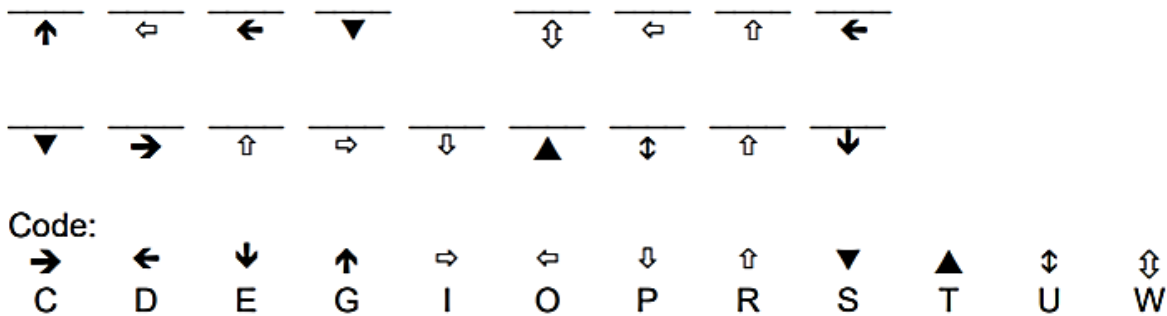
What is in the Bible?

Seven Ways That the Bible Is Unique

1. **Unique in Authorship.** The Bible was written by over forty different people from a whole range of backgrounds over 1500 years. Authors include kings (Solomon and David), fishermen (Peter), doctors (Luke), military leaders (Joshua), tax collectors (Matthew), and even some who are unknown. Biblical writers include almost every type of person: wise and foolish, faithful and treacherous, rich and poor, innocent and guilty, and young and old.

2. **Unique in Literary Genre.** The Bible is written in a multitude of distinct literary forms (or genres) containing over 10,000 events. It includes poetry (Song of Songs), history (Exodus), law (Leviticus), historical biographies (Gospels), songs (Psalms), wise sayings (Proverbs), letters (e.g., Romans), and more. Other ancient literary works utilize a multiplicity of literary genres, but the biblical authors use them to focus their audience's attention on one supreme metanarrative (one story).

3. Unique in its Languages. The Bible is originally written in three different languages (Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek). Each of these dialects has a particular way of using words, painting images, and describing reality. Quite obviously, most books are written in one language alone.

4. Unique in its Teachings. The Bible contains unique teachings not found in any of the other religious texts of the world. For instance, Christian Scriptures uniquely teach that salvation is by grace alone, a free gift from God to anyone who will receive it. There are other religions that offer forms of grace, but none that offer grace as a no-strings-attached gift (e.g., Ephesians 2:8-9).

5. Unique in its Impact. The Bible has shaped Western civilization more than any other book. Its influence is unmistakable on art, music, literature, history, government, and so on. And despite the common mantra, the Bible was not a hindrance to the development of science. In fact, quite the opposite is true: Christian theology was essential for the rise of science.

6. Unique in its Circulation. From early handwritten manuscripts, to the invention of the printing press, to the ubiquity of the Internet, the Bible is the most widely circulated book in history. Rarely does a book reach the bestseller list or sell a hundred thousand copies. But the Bible has sold billions of copies and been printed tens of billions of times. No other book is even close.

7. Unique in its Survival. No other written work has been as critiqued, scrutinized, or challenged as the Bible. The Bible has survived the attack of the Roman Emperor Diocletian in the 3rd-4th centuries, 18th century biblical criticism, and 20th century postmodern theory. There is currently a resurgence of scholarship defending the reliability of the Bible.



Bible Organization

The Bible is organized into two divisions 1) the Old Testament and 2) the New Testament. The Old Testament contains everything before the birth of Christ from Creation to the Prophecies about Christ, and the New Testament contains everything about the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ all the way to the book of Revelation. **Complete the word search to see which books are in the Old Testament:**

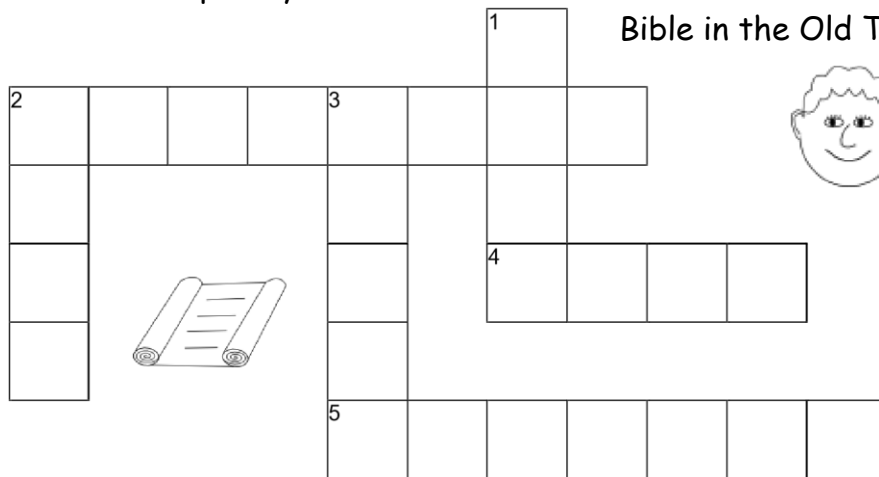

How to Look Up a Verse Reference

People quote the Bible in a variety of contexts. If you want to be able to look those quotes up, you'll need to understand the way the Bible is organized.



1. How to find the book of the verse

When Bible verses are listed, the first thing you'll see after the verse is the name of a book (ex. Genesis 1:1- Genesis is the name of the book). Use the table of contents in your Bible to locate that book within it. The table of contents is at the *beginning* of the Bible. Locate the name in the table of contents and turn to the page associated with the start of the book. The name of the book might be *abbreviated* (a **shortened name**, ex. Gen 1:1, Gen means Genesis) or it can be spelled out completely like the precious example.

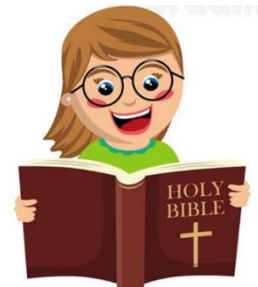

Note: Sometimes two or more books in the Bible have almost the same name, like 1 Samuel and 2 Samuel. (We say, "First Samuel" and "Second Samuel.") The number in the name of each book helps you to tell them apart.

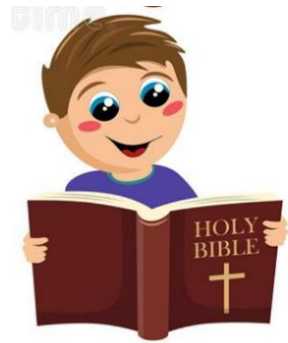
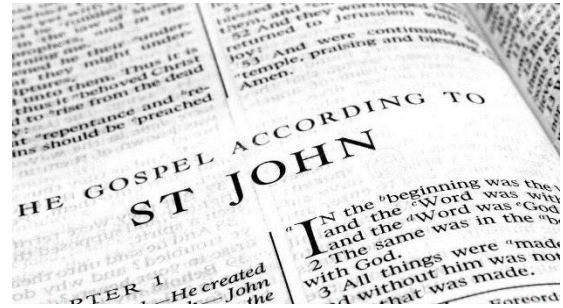

2. Find the Chapter

After the book name, you'll see two numbers. The first number is the chapter. For example, in "John 1:3", the "1" is the chapter number.



Some people may cite Bible verse using abbreviations and Roman numerals. For example, Lev. xx:13 is the same as Leviticus, chapter 20, verse 13.

Locate that chapter within the book. You may be able to find the location of that chapter in the table of contents. If not, you can scroll through the specific book until you see that chapter.

As with other books, it should clearly say, "Chapter ____" at the beginning of each chapter.

In addition, many versions clearly say, <Book name> <Chapter>:<Verse> at the top of each page indicating the first verse on that page. Some also note the last verse on the page.

3. Find the verse number.

The second number after the book name is the verse number. This number should come after a colon (:). In the case of John 1:3, the "3" would be the verse number.

If you're looking up a longer passage, there may be two numbers, separated by a hyphen (-). For example, in John 3:16-18, you're looking for verses 16,17, and 18.

4. Find the verse within the chapter.

Once you've found the chapter, go through it until you find the verse. The verses go in numerical order, just like chapters. There should be a small number at the beginning of each sentence or a small group of sentences. This is the verse number. If you're looking for multiple verses, such as John 3:16-18, 17 and 18 would follow directly after 16.

The word "gospel" means "good news." Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John tell the life story of Jesus - the good news that He came to earth to teach us about God and to die for our sins. The full names of all four books begin with the phrase: "The Gospels according to St. _____"

Matthew was one of Jesus' twelve disciples. **Mark** was John Mark, a cousin of Barnabas described in the book of Acts. **Luke** was a doctor. **John** was a disciple and was probably Jesus' cousin.

The Gospels talk about a lot of very important topics, such as:

- + The birth of Jesus
 - + All the names of Jesus
 - + Jesus' parables
 - + Jesus' miracles
 - + The Lord's prayer
 - + Institution of the Eucharist
- 
- + Jesus washes the Disciples' feet
 - + The crucifixion (death) of Jesus
 - + Jesus' resurrection from the dead

When praying, remember A.C.T.S., give God A- adoration (praise), tell Him your C-confession, give Him T-thanks and then you can give Him your S-supplication (what you're asking for) through the intercessions of a Saint of your choosing. 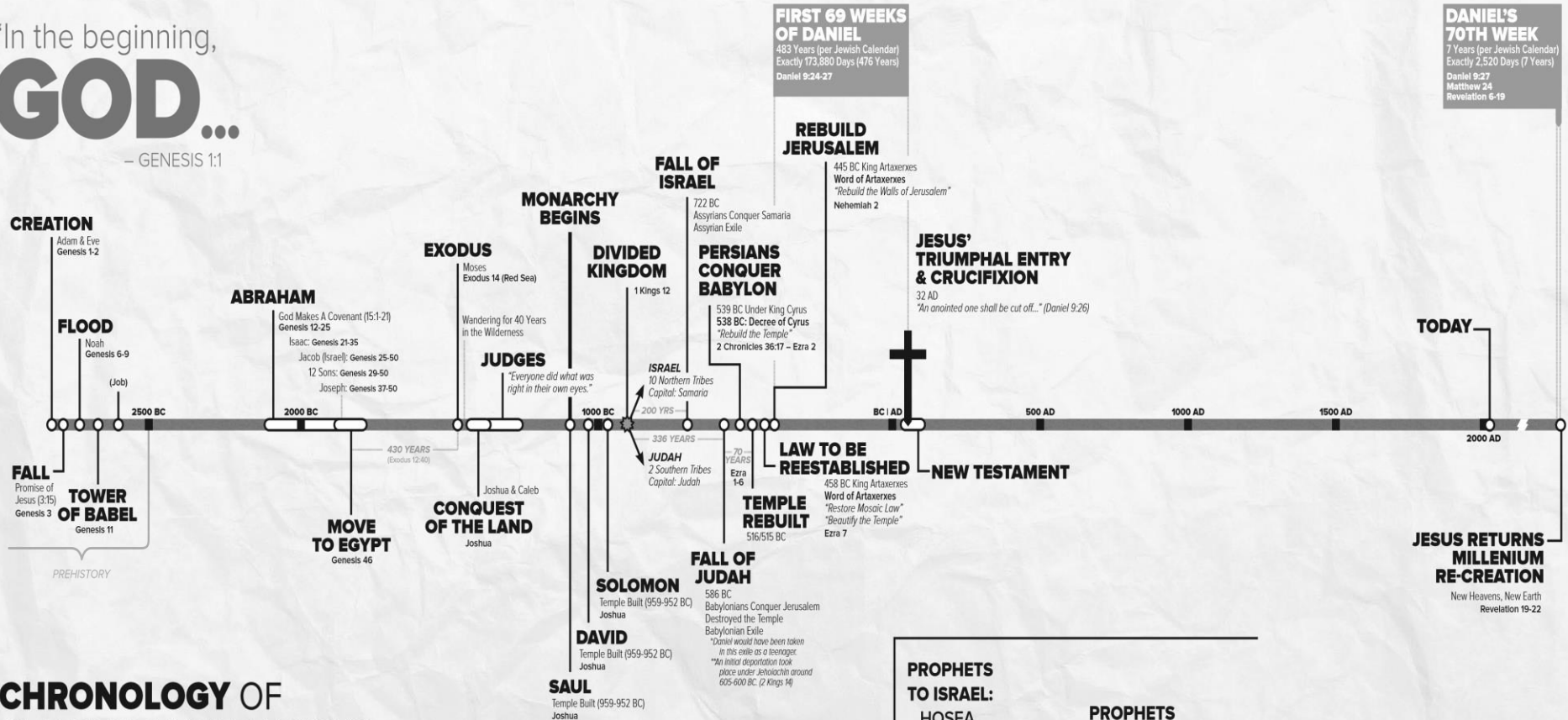


